ABOUT BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS OF COLORADO

Since 1918, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Colorado (BBBSC) has operated under the belief that inherent in every child is incredible potential. As part of the nation’s largest donor- and volunteer-supported mentoring network, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Colorado makes meaningful, monitored matches between adult volunteers (“Bigs”) and children (“Littles”), ages nine through young adulthood in Colorado. We develop positive relationships that have a direct and lasting effect on the lives of young people.

BBBSC serves youth through a portfolio of mentoring programs.

- Community-based is a traditional mentoring program. Mentee/mentor matches determine activities of mutual interest and meet two to four times per month.
- Sports Buddies is an innovative mentoring program started by BBBSC in 2000. Mentee/mentor matches meet one to two times per month for sports-based activities that are planned, scheduled, and overseen by BBBSC staff.
- Mentor Plus Programs go beyond the traditional one-to-one, adult-to-child mentoring model by providing programs focused on peer mentoring, group mentoring, and college and career readiness. With BBBSC’s professional support, matches develop authentic relationships that help youth achieve success now (both in and out of school) and long into the future (post-secondary education and the workforce).

QUALIFICATIONS

Our ideal candidate(s) will be a team player who demonstrates a passion for supporting mentoring through macro-level organizational support. This person will have outstanding customer service skills and is a natural problem solver. The internship requires the ability to work collaboratively with drive, enthusiasm, initiative, and flexibility.

Candidates must also possess the ability to set and accomplish goals. Must be highly organized with the ability to multitask, implement systems and follow-up processes, able to effectively work under pressure, use independent judgment, and produce a quality work product within tight time constraints. You should be able to work independently as you will work alongside our BBBS team members. Flexibility is a must quality/skill in this role.

- Must be enrolled in a Master of Social Work program at an accredited college or university. We currently have established partnerships with CSU, DU, and MSU.
- Demonstrate an interest in macro social work and community organizing.
- Possess strong communication, interpersonal, and organizational skills.
- Committed to social justice and advocacy for marginalized populations.
- Willingness to work flexible hours, including evenings and weekends.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team.
- Strong research, writing, and analytical skills.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office and other computer applications.
- Willingness to be flexible with the ebb and flowing needs of the organization.
